Many Gaelic learners want a variety of books to make their Gaelic richer. There are many books on Amazon but many of them are scams. Perhaps you've seen some.

Many of them are full of errors. Some are even made in Google Translate. These books will waste your money and your time.

Luckily, there is a quick, easy way to judge the quality of a Gaelic book on Amazon in 3 steps.


Let's try it on the following book (which is a scam):



Step 1: Click on the author's name on Amazon. In this example, it's Amyas Andrea.

Step 2: Look at the other books they offer. In this case, there are many, many other languages, including <u>Turkish for Beginners</u>, <u>Latin for Beginners</u>, and <u>Icelandic for Beginners</u>. I HIGHLY doubt that the author is fluent enough in these languages to make learning resources.







Step 3: Read the negative reviews. Chances are fluent speakers have noticed errors or scams.

If you want a little more peace of mind, ask one of the Gaelic groups on Facebook.

You deserve quality Gaelic learning materials. Following these 3 quick steps will save you time, money, and frustration.
