

Level 2 – Applied Knowledge

Primary Production of Feed

Session Date: Wednesday 29th April 2026

Session Time: 09.30 - 12.30

Objectives: This course provides an overview of the legislative requirements for businesses carrying out primary production of animal feed, primarily Annex I of Reg (EC)183/2005. It will focus on the application of feed hygiene to ensure safety of primary products at farms, and the further activities of mixing of feed for exclusive use at the farm. With explanations of the registration codes, illustrated by examples and real-life scenarios, this course will give the delegates the skills to carry out a primary production inspection, and identify situations where higher levels of inspections are necessary.

Trainer biography: Victoria studied Agricultural Biochemistry and Nutrition at Newcastle University in 1991. She completed a Masters in Animal Production at the University of Aberdeen in 1995, and worked as Assistant Nutritionist at North Eastern Farmers in Aberdeen, a large multi-species feed mill distributing feed across the North of Scotland. She then moved to the role of Nutritionist at Farmway, a multi-species mill in the North of England, and enjoyed 5 years as the mill nutritionist and out on farm, supporting dairy, beef and pig customers, designing their rations and advising on raw material buying. After 2 years spent at Optivite, a specialist nutrition company in Nottinghamshire, manufacturing premixes, additives and speciality ingredients, she built a feed consultancy business, Apeya Animal Nutrition, supporting feed businesses across the world in nutrition, auditing, feed safety training, legislative issues and still works as a nutritionist on farms. After 30 years, Victoria still says that she has the best job in the world!
