

A TLE Quickie

With so much going on daily, it's easy to get your words jumbled. Here's a quick little reference guide that just might help keep you sane!

The story of the 2's:

To	<i>preposition, adverb, or infinitive marker</i>	"He asked her to go, but she didn't want to."
Two	<i>numeric numeration, denoting amount</i>	"Cindy said she was two years old."
Too	<i>adverb (in addition or excessively)</i>	"She likes chocolate milk too."

Don't forget:

There	<i>adverb, or exclamation</i>	"We flew to Paris and stayed there eleven days."
Their	<i>determiner</i>	"Parents are keen to help their children."
They're	<i>contraction (they are)</i>	"They're going to the park after school."

Then we can count on:

Sale	<i>noun (exchange of a commodity for money, when a retailer cuts price for a limited period of time)</i>	"The store has it's annual sale on candles this week."
Sail	<i>noun or verb N - a wind-catching apparatus V - travel in a boat with sails; move smoothly.</i>	"The red sail billowing in the wind was eye catching."
Sell	<i>verb or noun V - to hand over something for money N - an act of selling or attempting to sell.</i>	"They will sell the car for \$300.00"

Last but not least:

Your	<i>determiner, belonging to or associated with the person or people that the speaker is addressing.</i>	"What is your name?"
You're	<i>contraction (you are)</i>	"You're a very special person."
Yore	<i>noun, of long ago or former times (used in nostalgic or mock-nostalgic recollection).</i>	"Tell us more about the legends of yore."
