


To ensure concept comprehension, participants will be prompted to answer review questions for each module. Upon successful completion of the course and review questions, participants will receive a Statement of Completion.

Topics

This course begins with an introduction to ESG & sustainability and circular economy, which are then followed by three easy-to-read modules:

Module 1

Boards' roles and the regulatory environment in Australia

- How boards oversee ESG & sustainability-related matters
- Directors' due care and diligence and related cases
- · Public reporting and disclosure requirements
- 'Greenwashing' and directors' duties
- Investment stewardship and stewardship codes

Module 2

ESG risks and opportunities, materiality, and the integration of ESG factors into strategy and risk management

- · How material ESG & sustainability risks and opportunities are identified
- · Materiality in the context of sustainability, including the concept of double materiality
- Integration of ESG & sustainability into strategy and risk management
- ESG targets, plans and metrics

Module 3

Sustainability disclosure standards, connecting ESG with financial performance & enterprise value, and the creation of shared value

- · ESG & sustainability disclosure system
- Overview of the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) standards, the Sustainability Accounting Standards Board (SASB) standards, the Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosures (TCFD) framework, and the Integrated Reporting <IR> framework, as well as a few other major frameworks
- Convergence of the sustainability reporting standards and the IFRS Sustainability
 Disclosure Standards climate & general requirement exposure drafts
- Sustainability report assurance
- · Connecting ESG & sustainability with financial performance & enterprise value
- Connecting businesses with economic, environmental, and societal value

The course finishes with a summary of twelve questions every board should consider as part of their responsibilities.


