Glass and Accessories List

Items available from Warm Glass:

	1 x 450g jar of clear fine frit
	$1 \times 450g$ of opal fine frit - can be white, yellow, French vanilla, orange, red,
	green, blues, grey (black can be a bit tricky, we will discuss why in class).
	If you want to mix it up a bit (optional!) small amounts (<100g jars) of any
	medium or coarse frit or powders. We will be testing the colours before we
	fill the final vessel.
	Small amount of clay (a large handful)
	2kg Premium Casting Plaster (OR plaster and flint from list below)
	Mixing bowl or bucket
	Good respirator
	Small off-cut of tekta (you can use up your scraps or a sheet about 30 x
	15cm approx. (This is only to do a few colour tests on, so dimensions do not
	need to be exact!!)
	Sickle stone

Alison predominately fills her moulds with a combination of clear fine frit and a coloured opal fine frit, though you can also add in small amounts of powder or coarse frit too.

In week one we will mix up tiny amounts of glass to test the final fired colours, before you fill the mould in week 2- so you can experiment!

As you see Alison is drawn to fairly mono chromatic colours- but you don't have to be!

fine wet and dry sandpaper -1 sheet is plenty 1 bag wallpaper paste Several mixing jars (yogurt pots etc) Several Spoons- large and small Talc - 2kg max - can be reused Water based gilding size (small bottle). For the gold leaf Alison likes to use transfer gold sheet.
